**Brief summary of issue or purpose of deputation:**

Ontario has been doing exceptionally well in containing the virus and minimizing the case number everyday. On July 6, the province had zero deaths from Covid19. We must not let this progress falter. The work of our first responders must not have been done in vain.

This is why mandating masks to be worn indoors is so crucial. Toronto has passed this, and eastern Ontario has just passed this law as well. I believe that Markham is capable of being just as responsible, if not more. My friends in health care have been in isolation from their families for months, and have sacrificed so much for our safety to get to where we are today. They, too, are Markham residents.

As a safety measure, we need to be wearing masks indoors to minimize the spread of Covid19.
