

2019 Community Investment Fund Results

The Community Investment Fund supports non-profit agencies for the delivery of community services that improve the well-being of York Region residents living with low and moderate income through four Community Result Areas.

Two service providers offered seasonal shelters to individuals in need for a total of **283** nights
