York Health Matters is a campaign that launched in November 2019 and is dedicated to raising awareness of the high quality service delivery provided by CUPE 905 members in the York Region & Long-term Care (YRLTC) unit. About the Week of Thanks

Through the York Health Matters campaign, we are launching the “Week of Thanks” for the York Region community to show thanks to those who continue to help keep them safe, healthy and their day-to-day lives running smoothly throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

Early on in the pandemic, images and drawings of rainbows began popping up in windows around the world and here in York Region. The sharing of rainbows was meant to symbolize hope in uncertain times, a sense of community and a message of thankfulness to front line workers. The “Week of Thanks” builds off this existing initiative by asking those in York Region to place a “thank you” message in the window or door of their home, classroom or business during the week of November 16th. This message is something that children or families can paint, draw or write out themselves, or they can print off a free pre-designed poster from yorkhealthmatters.ca/week-of-thanks.

The YRLTC Executive would like to formalize this initiative by having Regional Council declare the week of November 16, 2020 as “The Week of Thanks”. This declaration could be made at the Committee of the Whole’s meeting on November 5 and “The Week of Thanks” could be acknowledged again during the week itself at the Regional Council meeting on November 19.

This will be a valuable opportunity to unite the community and further educate the public about who is helping keep our communities healthy and safe amid the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, this will help promote the quality services provided to York Region residents every single day.
