# Background



### What is Interactive Voice Response (IVR)?

- The York Region Transit (YRT) IVR is an automated system, providing callers access to information using menu options
- IVR is the first point of contact for inbound calls
- Conventional and Mobility On-Request transit services each have their own separate IVR telephone numbers
- Callers can access information on:
  - Schedules, fares, detours, route and travel planning for Conventional services
  - Trip booking, cancellations and registration for Mobility On-Request services



# IVR Redesign Project Objectives

Look into:

- 1. Consolidating the Conventional and Mobility On-Request call centre telephone numbers, to allow YRT travelers to access self-serve options through a single telephone number to improve the customer experience
- **2. Simplifying** IVR navigation and remove menu options that are ineffective and underused to enhance the YRT user experience

## YRAAC Consultation

- A key project objective is consultation with the YRAAC
- Invite YRAAC members to participate on the project team as subject matter experts and provide feedback throughout the duration of the project
- YRAAC will be updated on solution recommendations by year end
