Immunization Roles and Responsibilities Update

FEDERAL UPDATE

Canada **

- By September 2021, every adult wishing to receive the vaccine will be immunized
- In addition to approving of the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines December 2020, Health Canada has approved two more vaccines
 - AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine: Requires two doses and is currently recommended by Health Canada for only individuals over the age of 55 years
 - 2. <u>Janssen COVID-19 vaccine:</u> Requires only one dose and is recommended for individuals 18 years of age and older
- National Advisory Commission on Immunizations extended dose intervals for COVID-19 vaccine to optimize early vaccine rollout and population protection in Canada

PROVINCIAL UPDATE

Ontario 👸

- Launched Provincial booking system for COVID-19 vaccines
- Expanded administration of COVID-19 vaccines through pharmacies and primary care settings
- Extended second dose intervals to 16 weeks
- Updated Ontario's COVID-19 vaccination plan to include information on the rollout of phase two of vaccine distribution

PROVINCIAL PHASE TWO VACCINE SEQUENCING

PHASE 1

High-Risk populations (approximately 1.8 million people)

- December 2020 March 2021
- Congregate living for seniors
- Health care workers
- Adults in First Nations, Métis and Inuit populations
- Adult chronic home care recipients
- Adults ages 80 and older
- Distribution through:
 hospital site clinics, mobile
 teams, site-specific clinics,
 mass vaccination clinics,
 pharmacies

PHASE 2 Mass deliveries of vaccines (approximately 9 million people)

- April 2021 June 2021
- Adults aged 60 to 79, in 5-year increments
- High-risk congregate settings (such as shelters, community living)
- Individuals with high-risk chronic conditions and their caregivers
- Those who cannot work from home
- At-risk populations
- Distribution through:
 mass vaccination clinics,
 pharmacies, primary care, site specific clinics, mobile teams,
 mobile sites, public health units

PHASE 3 Steady state

- July 2021 onwards
- Adults 59 years and younger
- Distribution through:
 mass vaccination clinics,
 pharmacies, primary care, site specific clinics, mobile teams,
 mobile sites, public health units

YORK REGION VACCINE ROLL OUT PLAN - UPDATE

Residents, staff and essential caregivers of LTCH/RH's	York Region residents 65 years of age and older
Highest and very health care workers	Faith leaders
Adult recipients of chronic home care (homebound and mobile)	Highest and high-risk health conditions (<i>coming soon</i> -hospital clinics)
Indigenous adults and members of their households	Hotspot communities
Residents and staff of high-risk congregate care setting for senior and individuals with developmental needs	Senior independent living (Public Health mobile immunization team)


APPROACHES FOR YORK REGION HOTSPOT COMMUNITIES

- The province has identified 114 high priority communities across Ontario based on COVID-19 incidence rates, hospitalizations and deaths, 13 of those communities in York Region
- Sub-prioritized based on vaccine supply to Five Postal codes

Strategies:


- Opening clinics in York Region hotspot communities (e.g., Aainiin Community Centre and Maple Community Centre)
- Offering vaccine to individuals 45-59 years of age and teachers who work or live-in hotspot communities
- Leveraging outreach and communication networks through local community organizations and the High Priority Community Strategy (e.g., Carefirst and the Vaughan Community Health Centre)
- Pharmacy roll-out of AstraZenca vaccine to individuals aged 55+

PHARMACY LOCATIONS WITH ASTRAZENCA VACCINE



44% OF WORKPLACE OUTBREAKS WERE IN MANUFACTURING

- 34% of all workplace outbreaks in York Region were product/materials manufacturing-related and 10% were in food manufacturing
- 34% of all York Region workplace outbreaks were located in Vaughan
- A majority of workplace outbreaks in Vaughan fall in the initial four Vaughan hot spots



- Moving down the age-bands (5-year increments) and phase two priority group
- Essential workers who cannot work from home
- Second dose planning (including shorter dose intervals for some priority groups/individuals)
