2020 Community Investment Fund Results

The Community Investment Fund supports non-profit agencies to deliver community services for York Region residents living with low and moderate income under four Community Results Areas. These services adapted and became critical to the 2020 pandemic response.

95% of funded community agencies moved to virtual programming and servicing, while others adapted to allow in-person services
