

Shareholder Direction

- Establishes governance and operating principles for the Board
- Designates officers of the corporation
- Includes the Property Management Services Agreement
- Aligns with the YorkNet Shareholder Direction
- Sets out the accountability relationship between the Region and Housing York

Management Agreement

• The Region provides management services to Housing York on a cost recovery basis (Housing York has no employees)










Rental Revenue (\$)
