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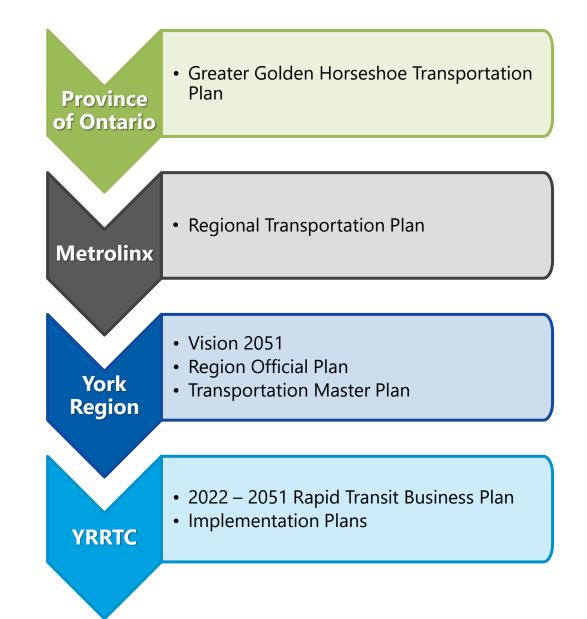
THE LARGEST SHARE OF POPULATION GROWTH IN THE GTHA

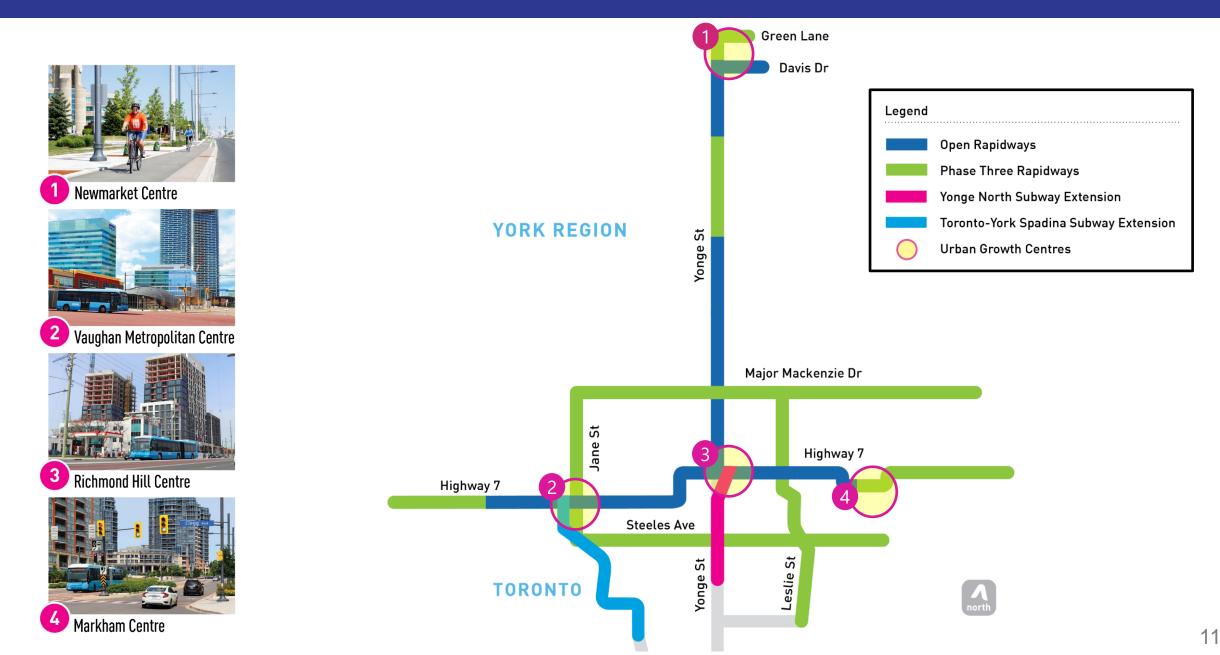

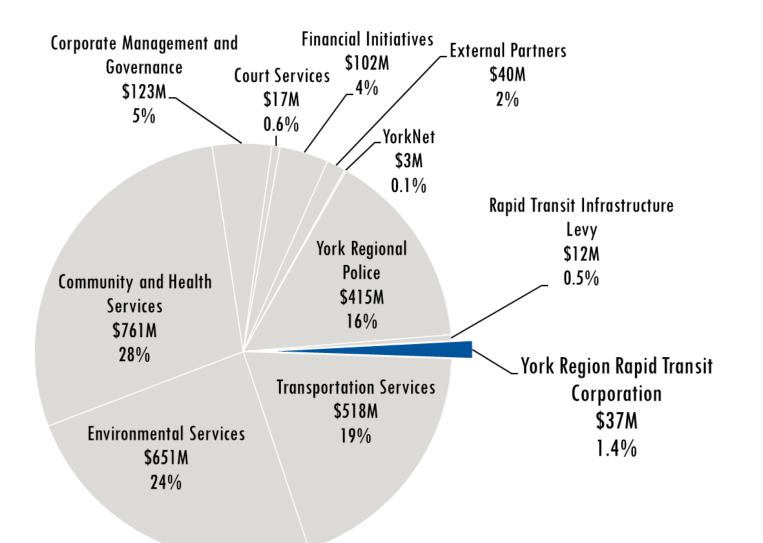

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YRRTC SHARE OF \$2.7B REGIONAL GROSS OPERATING EXPENDITURES



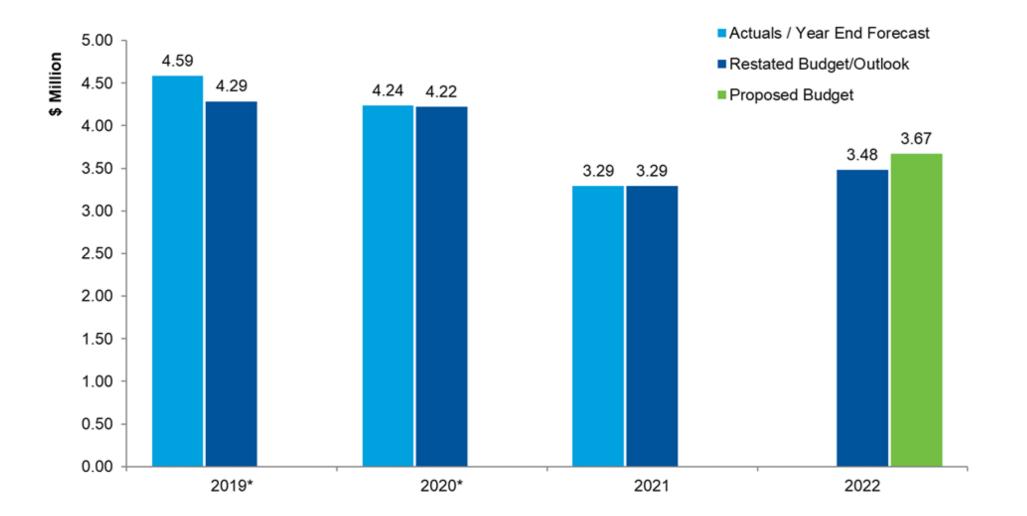

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PROPOSED 2022 NET OPERATING BUDGET COMPARED TO OUTLOOK

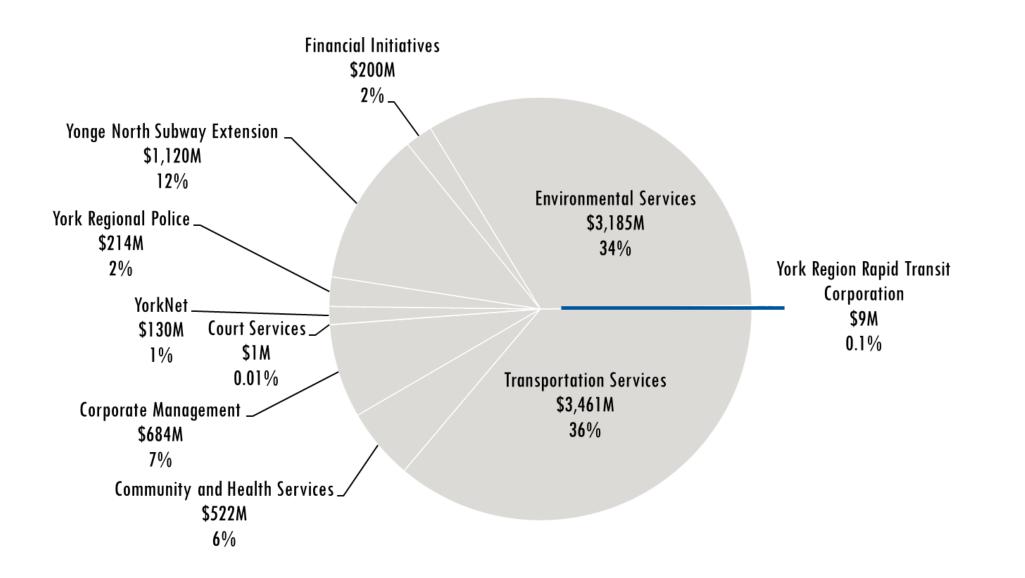


2022 Capital Expenditures budget

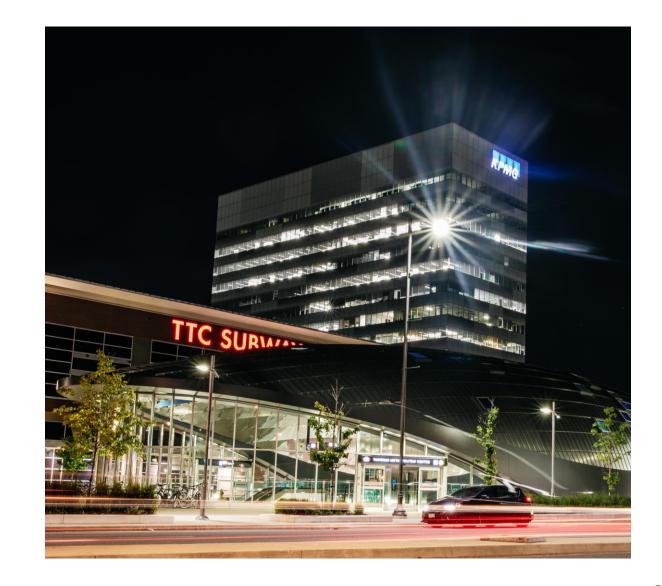
