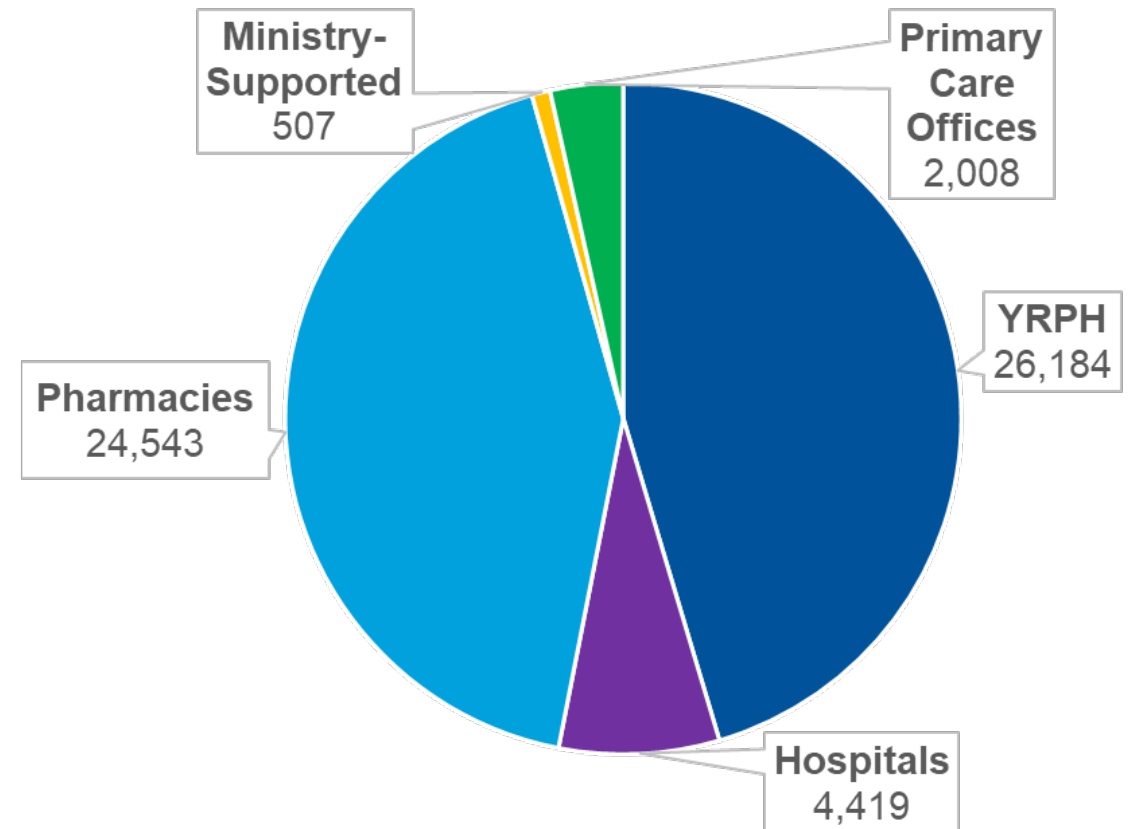


Current State — February 2022

Almost 2.2M doses of COVID-19 vaccines delivered in York Region

- York Region Public Health
 - 5 mass immunization clinics. 1170/day
 - Pop-up, school-based and congregate care clinics and homebound visits. 75/d
- Pharmacies
 - 190 Pharmacies delivered ~1170/d
- Doctors offices
 - 100 doses/d at primary care offices.
- York Region hospitals
 - Average of 210 doses per day

YRPH administered almost 50% of COVID-19 vaccines in York Region in Feb 2022



Public Health COVID-19 Vaccination program — Goals and Changes

Goal – to continue to provide convenient access to COVID-19 vaccination clinic services for York Region residents and be responsive to future vaccination needs

- **Vaccine Coverage:**

- Provide continued access to COVID-19 vaccination for YR residents
- Focus on populations with lower vaccine coverage
- Maintain ability to scale up/down if needed

- **Efficient Use of Resources:**

- Match vaccine clinic capacity to demand
- Maximize use of municipal spaces for community/recreational purposes.

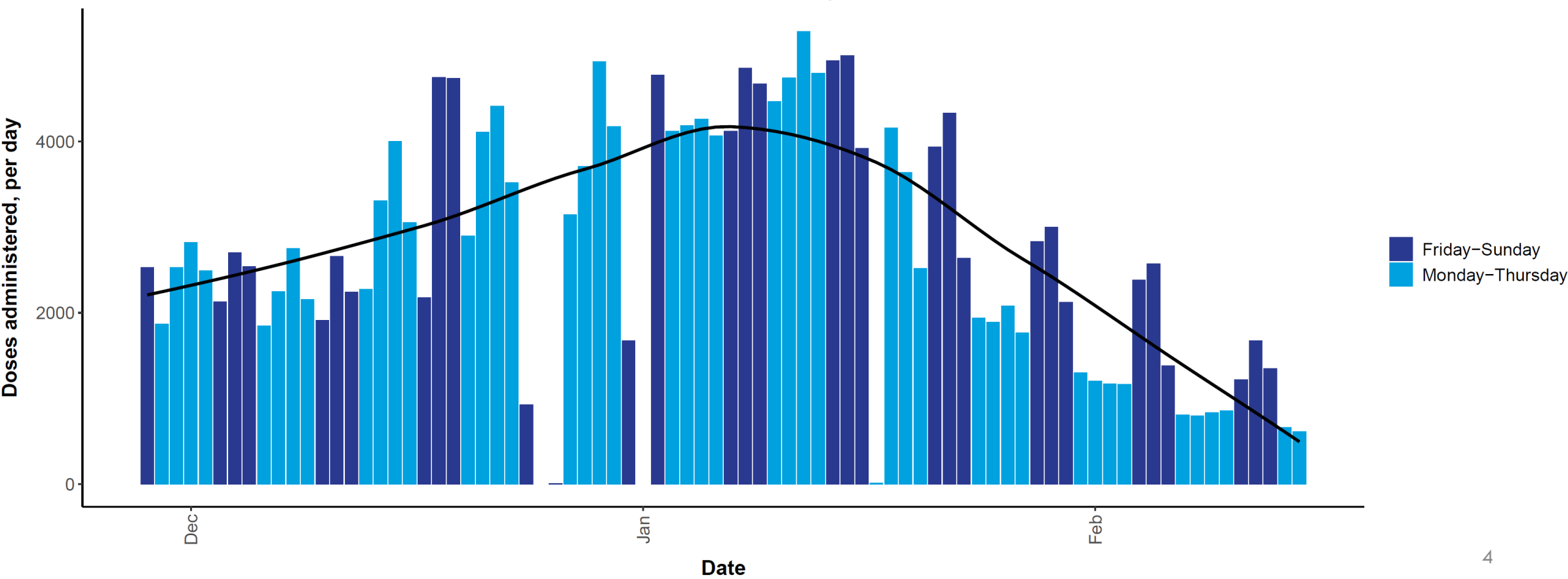

TRANSITION OF VACCINATION CLINICS

PHASE 1

Underway

- Reduce number of appointments to meet current demand
- No change in hours or sites
- 5 fixed clinics/day
- 1 mobile team

PHASE 2

Late February

- Combine Newmarket clinic site with Southlake Community Ontario Health Team
- Reduce Georgina clinic days per week
- 4-5 fixed clinics/day
- 1 mobile team

PHASE 3

Throughout March

- Transition to new clinic sites operating up to 5 days a week with 7-hour days
- Evening and weekend availability will continue
- 4 fixed clinics/day
- 2 mobile teams

PHASE 4

Late March

- Transition from Health Emergency Operations Centre to normal operations in Public Health
- 4 fixed clinics/day
- 2 mobile teams

FUTURE STATE

- Transition to 5 days/week, 7-hour day operations with clinic sites in :
 1. West Georgina **and** Central Newmarket (running alternate days)
 2. West Vaughan
 3. Central **or** North Richmond Hill
 4. Central Markham
- Evening and weekend availability will continue
- Two mobile teams/day providing clinics within Long-Term Care and Retirement homes, schools, communities farther from fixed sites (e.g., North Georgina, Whitchurch-Stouffville, King Township, East Gwillimbury), and to populations with lower rates of vaccination

NEXT STEPS

- Transition planning and implementation
- Continue actively promoting and providing access to COVID-19 vaccine for YR residents
- Maintain ability to scale up and down as needed
- Continue to re-assess the program to efficiently use resources and space
