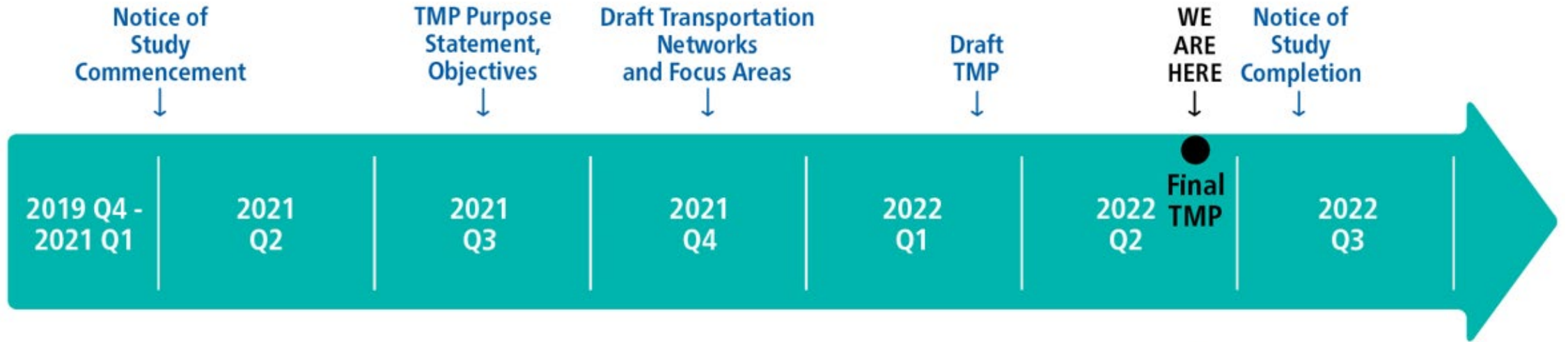

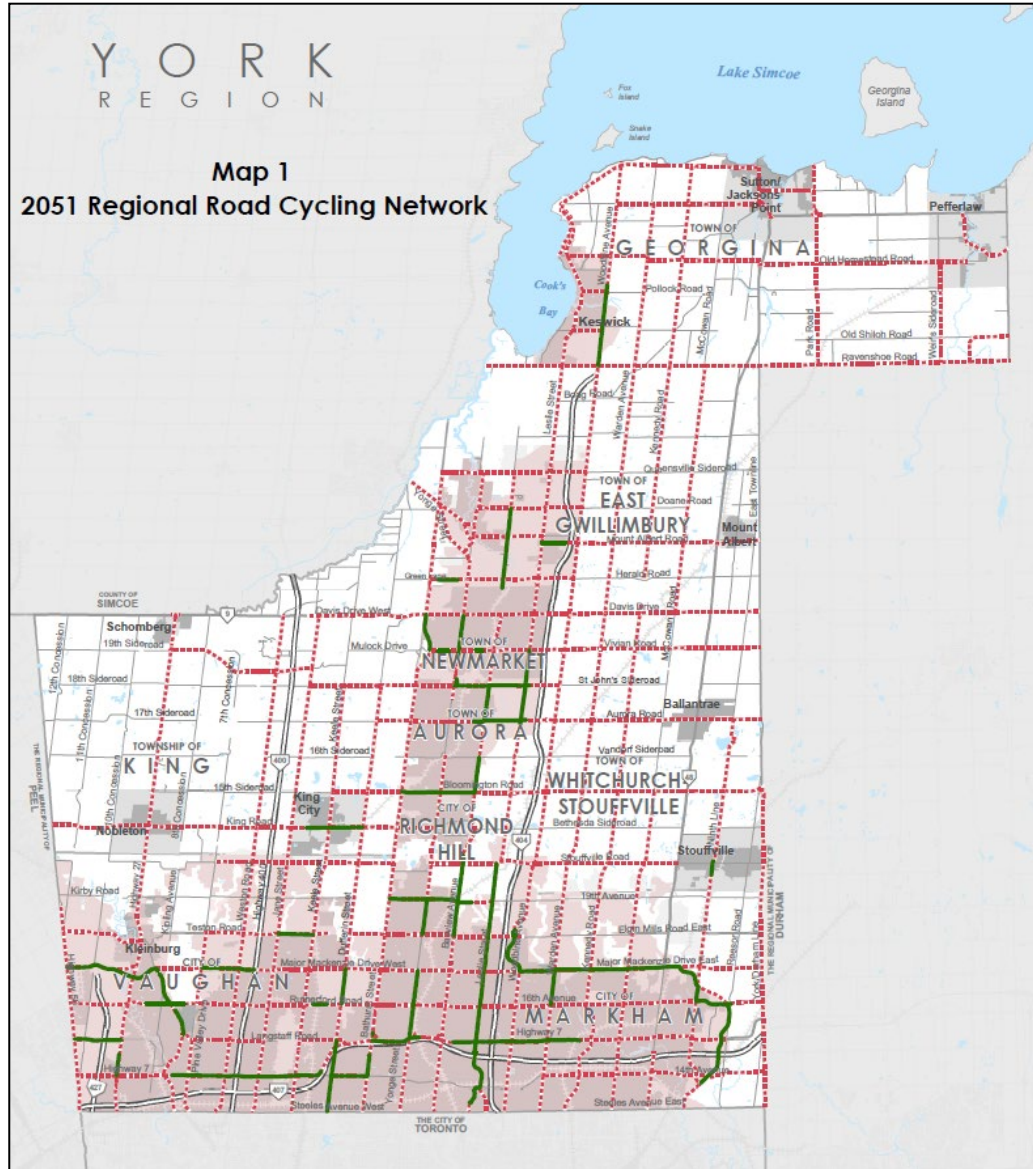

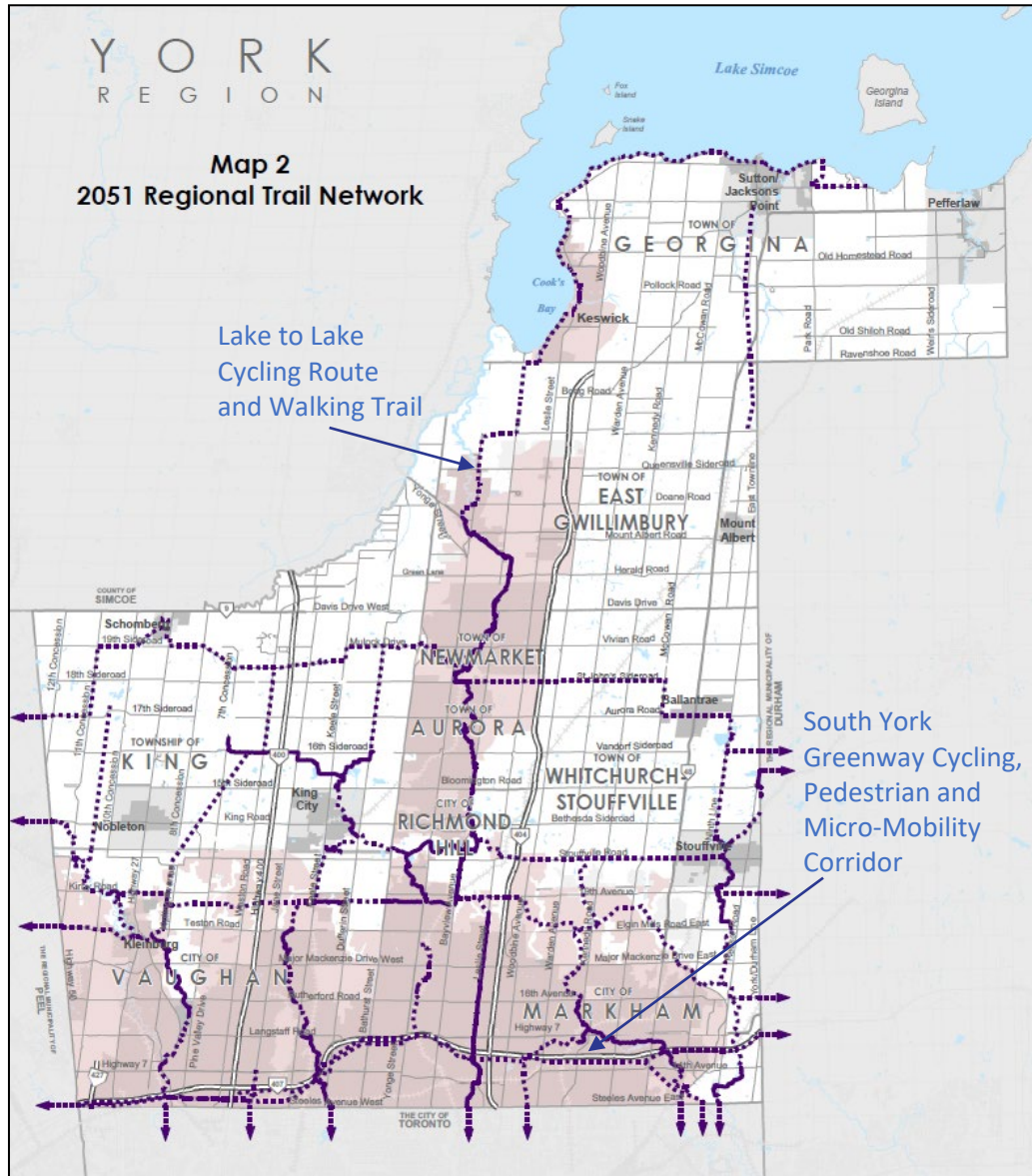
2051 REGIONAL ROAD CYCLING NETWORK



KEY POINTS:

- Increased interest in cycling along Regional corridors
- Corridors to support all modes
- Separated cycling facilities are preferred
- \$496 million for stand-alone active transportation projects

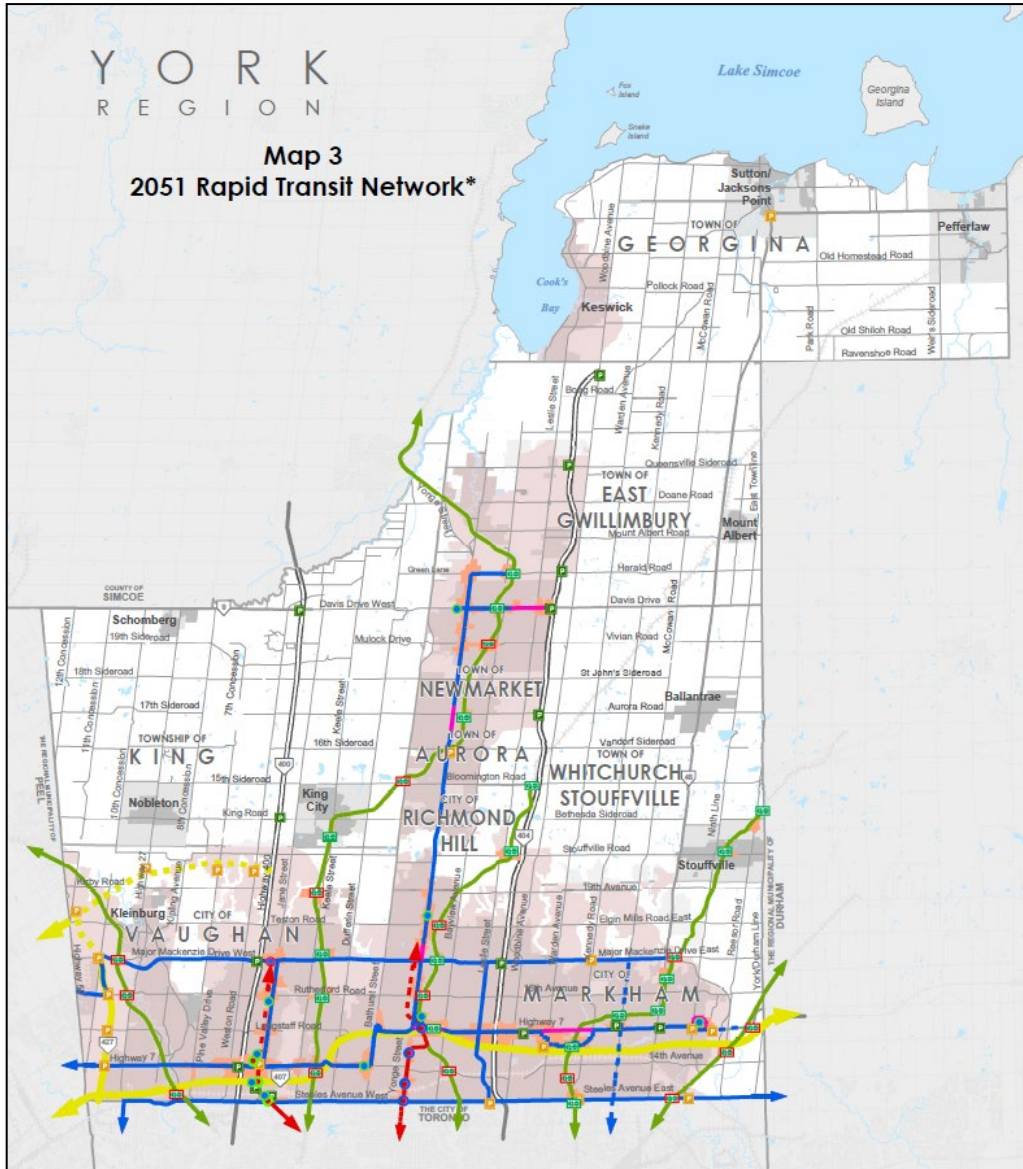
2051 REGIONAL TRAIL NETWORK



KEY POINTS:

- Cyclists can use trails network
- Partnering with local municipalities and conservation authorities
- Expanded emphasis on cycling routes of regional significance
- Connections beyond Region's boundaries

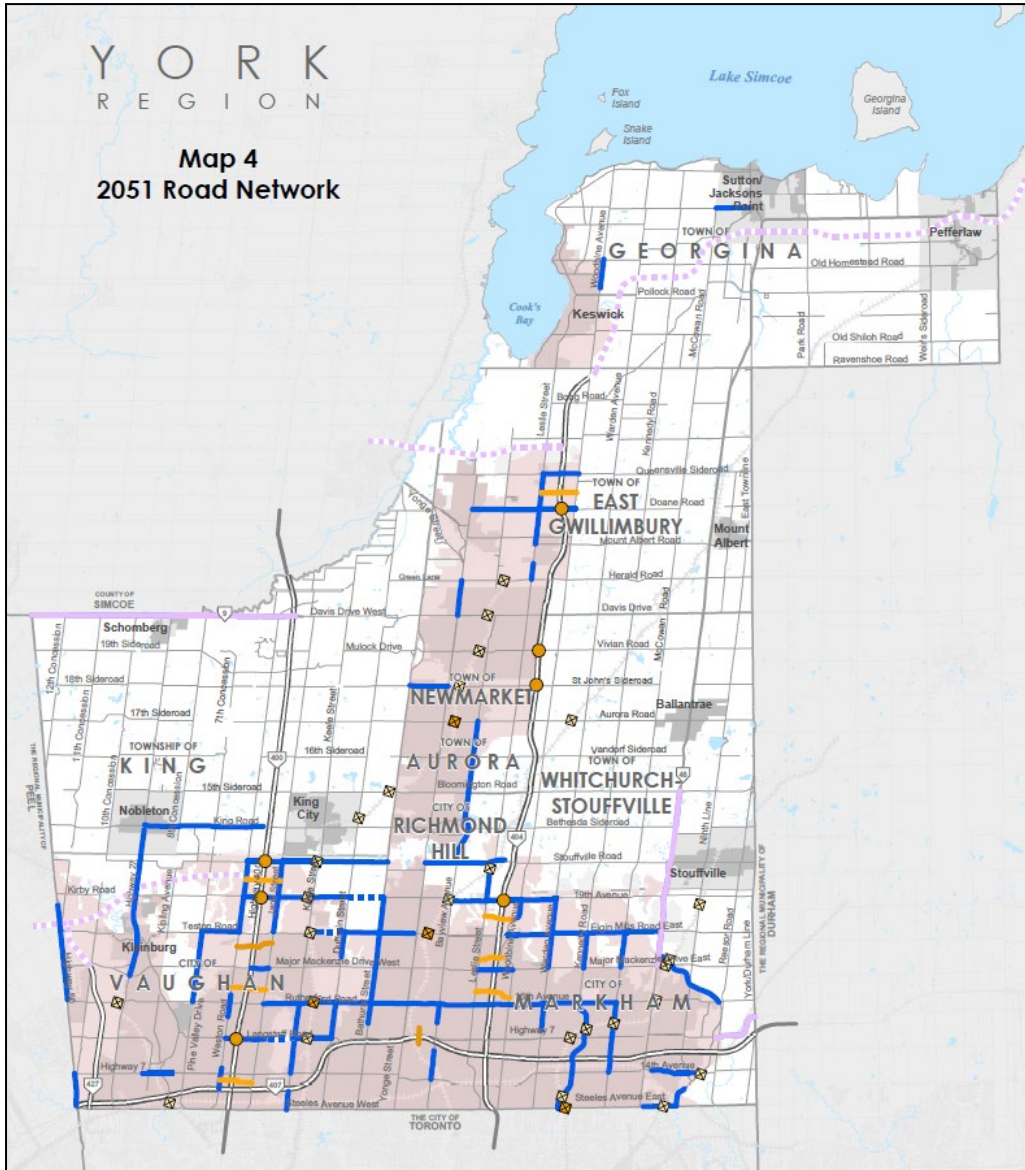
2051 RAPID TRANSIT NETWORK



KEY POINTS:

- Consistent with provincial plans
- Identifies Region's long-term interests
- Includes existing and future rapid transit stations which inform land use planning
- Focus on transit infrastructure
- \$12.4 billion for transit projects

2051 ROAD NETWORK



KEY POINTS:

- Car continues as primary travel choice for many residents
- Delivery of road network relies on partnerships
- Project details determined through environmental assessments
- \$4.2 billion for road projects

2022 TMP FOCUS AREAS

1. **Safety** for all travellers
2. **Transportation equity** - providing options that are inclusive and recognize a diversity of personal abilities, age, gender, income and culture
3. **Reduce car travel** – especially during rush hours
4. Fiscal and environmental sustainability
5. Review role and function of **Regional corridors**
