# **MEMORANDUM**

Re:	2023-24 Provincial Budget Consultation

This memorandum updates Members of the Committee of the Whole on staff's proposed submission as part of the Province of Ontario's 2023-24 Budget consultation process.

#### Consultation on the March Budget is open until February 10th

On December 8, 2022, the Minister of Finance <u>announced</u> an opportunity for stakeholders to provide input to the Province of Ontario's 2023-24 Budget process. These submissions will be considered by the Province as it sets its priorities for the Ontario economy. The 2023-24 Budget is expected to be delivered in March.

While in-person consultations are being held across the province from January 11 until February 10, there is also an <u>opportunity</u> to provide written submissions by February 10, 2023. The consultation framework does not limit the matters that can be covered through a written submission.

#### The proposed comments reflect positions previously taken by Council

Staff propose to submit comments consistent with, and supported by, previous Council positions, including those from the following reports:

<u>Housing Solutions 2021 Progress Report and 2022 Action Plan</u> (June 2022) <u>Implications of Bill 23, More Homes Built Faster Act, 2022</u> (December 2022)<sup>1</sup> <u>Yonge North Subway Extension Update</u> (January 2023)

The proposed comments to be submitted are summarized in the table below.

Areas to address	Key Request and Rationale
Bill 23 Financial Impact	<ul> <li>Contribute to the cost of regional growth-related infrastructure to ensure the Region is kept financially whole as it strives to achieve the new housing targets of 125,000 homes over ten years</li> <li>Changes to the Development Charges Act could result in development charges revenues shortfalls of between \$500 million and \$1.6 billion over the next ten years, requiring a one-time taxy levy increase of between 2.3% and 7.3% and a one-time water and wastewater rate increase of between 5% and 14.3%</li> <li>Phase-ins and the development charges-ineligibility of costs for housing, land, and studies are expected to reduce development charge revenue by \$500 million (~10%) over the next ten years. A new cost-shared infrastructure program, focused on municipal growth-related infrastructure could help York Region avoid reducing its planned growth-related infrastructure by \$500 million or avoid a one-time tax levy increase of 5%</li> <li>Potential housing exemptions and discounts, depending upon regulatory guidance could result in an additional \$1.1 billion (~25%) in lost revenues over the next ten years. A new, larger, cost-shared infrastructure could help York Region avoid reducing its planned growth-related infrastructure by an additional \$1.1 billion (\$1.6 billion total) or avoid an additional one-time taxy levy increase of 5% (7.3% total) and an additional one-time taxy levy increase of 5% (7.3% total) and an additional water and wastewater user rate increase of 9.3% (14.3% total)</li> </ul>
Community Health Needs	<ul> <li>Maintain 100% funding for COVID-19 response and recovery impacts in 2023, which are currently estimated at \$54.9 million for Public Health, and \$13.1 million for Long Term Care and Paramedic Services</li> <li>Provide \$5 million in each of 2023, 2024, and 2025 for the Ontario Seniors Dental Program to resolve 1,000 of the 7,500 backlogged applications per year, and an additional \$0.8 million in 2023 for the shortfall in capital costs.</li> </ul>

## Proposed 2023-24 Provincial Budget Consultation Submission

Housing Affordability Challenges	<ul> <li>Commit \$216 million as the Province's one-third share of funding for up to 1,850 new community housing units over the next 10 years</li> <li>Allocate York Region's share of Non-Resident Speculation Tax revenue to support affordable housing, estimated at \$215 million to date</li> </ul>
Public Works Priorities	<ul> <li>Cap York Region's capital contribution to the Yonge North Subway Extension at the preliminary estimate of \$1.12 billion</li> <li>Maintain transit-stream Safe Restart Agreement funding to support shortfalls of \$30 million in 2023 and \$21 million in 2024</li> <li>Contribute at least \$100 million towards the <i>York Region sewer works project</i> to recover York Region's lost investment as a result of the new direction from the <i>Supporting Growth and Housing in York and Durham Regions Act, 2022</i></li> <li>Provide sufficient funding required to implement transit fare integration and offset farebox inequities in the GTHA</li> </ul>
