


#### Operating Budget Funding by Source (%)\*

### EXPENDITURES AND TAX LEVY IMPACT BY SERVICE AREA











# FINANCIAL IMPACTS OF COVID-19 ARE PROJECTED TO DECLINE




# CONTRIBUTIONS TO CAPITAL RESERVES INCREASE OVER TIME








# DEBT LEVELS ARE CAREFULLY MANAGED

### **Net Outstanding Debt Forecast**








