



- Provide technical expertise to support York Region and local municipalities, as requested, to inform the MCR and OPR processes.
- Finalize online and interactive Hubs for Watershed Planning and Implementation Tracking.

- Continue to evaluate, mitigate and update programs and services in response to Bill 23
- Updates to TRCA planning and regulatory policies and procedures to reflect updated legislation and enhance streamlining





Water Risk Management







- Preliminary design work for rehabilitation of Stouffville Flood Control Channel to replace deteriorating lining
- Operation and maintenance of 7 stream gauges, 12 rain gauges and 3 snow courses.

Stouffville Dam Post Embankment Maintenance

 Preliminary approval for \$1.8M in federal funding (DMAF) to conduct the Beverley Acres German Mills Creek Erosion Control Project. The proposed project will replace a series of failing erosion control structures owned by York Region and restore over 330 m of channel for infrastructure and private property protection.






York SIECMP (2011 – 2021) Streambank Infrastructure Erosion Control Management Program

York SIECMP Next Steps

Continue "boots-on-the-ground" monitoring and channel survey data collection of the Region's linear infrastructure assets being threatened erosion

- Continue LiDAR data collection
 - Data acquisition at a watershed-scale and at a reach scale using drones
- Identify existing erosion control structures
 - Confirm erosion control asset condition
 - Identify protected infrastructure asset(s)
- Identify high risk remediation opportunities
 - Confirm protected asset value to Region (O.Reg. 588/17)
 - Cost-sharing potential between Region and lower-tier municipalities

Regional Biodiversity



- North Maple Regional Park
 - Contracted to implement the restoration of the natural area corridor within North Maple Regional Park (Vaughan) which will include approximately 700 m shoreline restoration; 1.5 ha wetland restoration; 2 ha of upland habitat restoration
- Two Billion Trees Planting in Rouge National Urban Park (RNUP)
 - TRCA has partnered with the Federal 2 Billion Trees Program to plant 45,000 stems planting in RNUP which will account for approximately 33 ha of reforestation.

- On-going trail counts at Boyd Conservation Park, Bruce's Mill Conservation Park and Oak Ridges Corridor Conservation Reserve.
- Continue property condition assessments and hazard mitigation on over 4,400 ha of land.

Boyd

- TRCA was awarded a total of \$1,719,745 for works to be completed in York Region through the Federal Economic **Development Agency for Southern** Ontario's CCRF.
- The funding will support 3 infrastructure projects at Boyd Conservation Park in Vaughan, Bruce's Mill Conservation Park in Whitchurch-Stouffville and the Oak Ridges Corridor Conservation Reserve in Richmond Hill.



Education & Outreach









Bruce's Mill

- Will establish a 4-season presence at Bruce's Mill Conservation Park designing and delivering a suite of free and fee-forservice educational programs for public visitors, school and corporate groups and summer camps.
 - Activities will include Maple Syrup demonstrations, summer camp nature programs, guided nature walks and fall and winter themed family events.




2022 Additional Leveraged Funding


