# Contract Awards, including Emergency Purchases, Fast Tracks, and Renewals between July 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022

#### 1. Recommendations

Council receive this report for information.

#### 2. Summary

This report advises Council of all contract awards, including emergency purchases, fast tracks and renewals, pursuant to Sections 6.2(g), 15.4, 16.3, 17.6, and 21.8 of the <a href="Procurement Bylaw 2021-103">Procurement Bylaw 2021-103</a> ("the Bylaw"), which identifies that a report shall be submitted to Council regularly to advise of procurement activities.

#### **Key Points:**

#### 3. Background

## This report reflects the lowered competitive procurement threshold and other changes in the new Procurement Bylaw (2021-103)

The new Bylaw came into effect on January 1, 2022, and lowered the competitive procurement threshold from \$150,000 to \$100,000, ensuring alignment with the requirements of domestic and international trade treaties.

To increase process efficiency, the new Bylaw accords greater authority to the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to award contracts resulting from Requests for Tenders (RFTs) or Requests for Proposals (RFPs), at any value, including RFPs over \$2,000,000, provided the cumulative term of contract does not exceed five years. In the previous Purchasing Bylaw 2017-30, RFPs over \$2,000,000 required Council approval to award.

The new Bylaw also transfers authority for the award of optional renewal terms from the CAO to Commissioners, regardless of value, as long as the contracts are procured in accordance with the new Bylaw. As an additional efficiency, in February 2022, the CAO further delegated authority to Commissioners to renew procurements awarded under past bylaws. As such, all renewals reported in 2022 and beyond will be identified at the Commissioner approval level.

The new Bylaw also accords greater authority to the CAO for non-standard procurements, with a total cost of over \$100,000 up to \$500,000. Council will no longer be required to approve procurements at this threshold through the Contract Awards and Amendments Requiring Council Approval Report.

#### 4. Analysis

### Contract awards, including emergency purchases, fast tracks, and renewals have a total value of \$563,704,877

Table 1 identifies all the contract awards including emergency purchases, fast tracks and renewals authorized by the Commissioners, and the CAO and Regional Chair, as applicable, from Q3 and Q4 2022.

#### COVID-19 related procurement activities have been identified in this report

Table 2 outlines the total volume and value of COVID-19 related procurements in 2022.

The Region continues to prepare for new waves of COVID-19, which will result in procurement volume volatility due to operational demands. The volume of activities will depend on the severity of future COVID-19 waves and staff continue to proactively monitor and prepare for associated procurement needs.

In Q3, the COVID-19 items were related to extensions and increases for the provision of healthcare supplies, professional healthcare services, and biomedical waste pick-up and removal services for the Newmarket and Maple long-term care centres.

In Q4, the COVID-19 items were related to time-only extensions for the provision of courier services, biomedical waste pick-up and removal services, and cleaning supplies for the Newmarket and Maple long-term care centres, as well as the Regional Immunization clinics and mobile clinics.

#### As of year-end, contract awards including emergency purchases, fast tracks and renewals reported through the quarterly reports have a total value of \$945,883,202

As summarized in Table 3, in total, 442 procurement activities were awarded in 2022, in the value of \$945,883,202.
