Health System Transformation

Ontario Health Teams and home and community care modernization create opportunities for a fundamental shift in care delivery, planning and coordination for seniors.



Integrated Health AND Social Care

Wrap-around care that is tailored to seniors' needs.

Focused on upstream prevention and rehabilitation.

People Aging Safely At Home

85% of seniors who receive home care services say the service helped them stay at home.

91% of seniors want to stay at home if they are on a waitlist for a LTC, and additional supports could be provided to keep them at home or living with a family member.

People Aging Safely At Home

3.7% of seniors live in long-term care in Denmark

4.8% of seniors live in long-term care in Ontario
