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COVID-19 FALL 2023 UPDATE

Global and Local Pandemic Status

- Increasing indicators wastewater, institutional outbreaks, hospitalizations, percent positivity, new variants (EG5.1, BA 2.86). Deaths stable
- Southern Hemisphere flu and COVID
 - Early season, moderately severe, under 15 affected, <5 severely
 - Good flu vaccine match (98-99% match; 52% effective against hospitalization)

We are Prepared

- Integration of COVID-19 work into infectious disease division
- Vaccine clinics at the ready COVID and Flu five fixed sites; RSV in LTC
- Proactive support and audits of LongTerm Care and congregate settings (88% done)
- Local, interdepartmental, health care and Provincial outbreak exercises


What to expect

- Increased activity for public health and acute care
- Unlikely any mandatory measures

PUBLIC HEALTH POST-PANDEMIC CATCHUP

Infectious Diseases

- Immunization Catchup in-school, community clinics, engagement campaign
- Immunization of School Pupil Act (ISPA) enforcement (seven-to-eight years of age)
- Immunization Connect Ontario (ICON) online reporting

PUBLIC HEALTH POST-PANDEMIC CATCHUP

Health Protection

- Food safety (new online portal), personal service setting, water pre-covid
- Tick, WestNile surveillance, tobacco enforcement pre-covid
- Infection Prevention and Control augmented

Healthy Living

- Updated Opioid Action Plan, Harm Reduction services resumed
- School programming augmented mental health focus
- Sexual Health Clinics outreach, in-person, virtual care, HIV, MPOX augmented




PUBLIC HEALTH POST-PANDEMIC CATCHUP

Child and Family Health

- Virtual and in-person infant feeding clinics, Healthy Babies Healthy
 Children home visiting, parenting groups exceeding pre-pandemic levels
- Oral health screening in schools, children preventive clinic pre-covid service
- Senior emergency dental backlog resolved
- Innovation pre-natal mental health app, CBT transition to parenting


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


COVID-19 IN YORK REGION PUBLIC HEALTH




COVID-19 OUTBREAKS
