

## **CONTEXT SETTING**

### **Responsibilities of Federal and Provincial Governments**



Federal

Reduce chronic homelessness nationally by 50% by 2027/2028

GOAL

- National Housing Strategy
- Reaching Home: Canada's Homelessness Strategy
- Provides **Capital Funding** through grants and loans
- Homeless Individuals and Families Information System (HIFIS)
- Mandates Point-In-Time Counts for federally designated community entities

### **Provincial**

#### Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing

- Housing Services Act, 2011
- Provincial Homelessness Prevention Program (PHPP)
- Requires Service Managers maintain a By-Name List
- Mandates Point-In-Time Counts for Service Managers

#### Ministry of Health

- Funds health-oriented programs delivered by Service Managers including mental health and addiction services
- Funds and oversees supportive housing

#### Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services

- Social Assistance
- Funds and oversees Violence Against Women shelters

### **Responsibilities of Federal and Provincial Governments**



### **Regional Municipality of York**

Service Manager, responsible for planning, development, implementation and delivery of housing and homelessness services under the *Housing Services, Act, 2011.* 

- 10-year housing and homelessness plan sets policy direction:
  - o Increase supply of affordable and rental housing
  - Help people find and keep housing
  - Strengthen the housing and homelessness system
- Actions include emergency and transitional housing, eviction prevention programs, and outreach services



Local Community Service Providers

- Funded by all levels of government to deliver front-line services
- York Region partner



#### Local Municipalities

- Partner in planning and providing homelessness services
- Develop by-laws for public property
- Contributing to and approving plans for new developments

# Growing housing unaffordability and lack of deep affordable housing options

- Average rent for purpose-built apartments in York Region in 2022 was \$1,489, up 9% from 2019 (Source: Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation)
- York Region had highest proportion of renter and owner households spending 30% or more of gross income on housing costs in GTHA (Source: 2021 Census)
- Cost for room rentals in shared accommodation across the Region ranges from \$800 to \$1,000 per month (Source: Community Service Providers)



# Cost of living and inadequate income support programs

- Rates for Ontario Works have not increased since 2018
- In March 2023, over 1.9 million visits to food banks reported in Canada, a 32% increase from March 2022 (Source: Food Banks Canada)
- In 2022, 29% of families whose major source of income was government income support, were food insecure (Source: Statistics Canada)



### An overburdened healthcare system

•Ontario Medical Association estimates 2.2 million Ontarians are without a family doctor

•1 in 5 Canadians experience mental illness each year (Source Canadian Institute for Health Information)

•2021 Point-in-Time Count found that rates of mental health issues among people experiencing homelessness increased from 48% in 2018 to 64% in 2021

- $\circ$  48% of respondents self-reported a substance use issue
- 56% self-reported visiting an emergency department within last year, and of these, 18% estimated they had over five visits





# Increasing frequency of extreme weather conditions

- People experiencing homelessness may spend extended periods of time outside, which can have negative health impacts during extreme weather
- On average during each of the past 3 winter seasons, York Region has experienced 12-15 cold weather alerts






# Housing as a Human Right and Justice Valente's Waterloo decision


- Encampments and number of people living unsheltered is increasing across Ontario and in York Region
- In some municipalities in Ontario, by-laws meant to restrict people from living on public property have been challenged or paused

# Average Length of Stay (days) in Emergency Housing in York Region 2018 - 2023 (Jan-Oct)


