#### About accessibility laws

The <u>Accessibility for Ontorians with Disabilities Act. 2005</u> (AODA) is intended to reduce and remove barriers for people with disabilities so that Ontario can become more accessible and inclusive for everyone. Collaboration among businesses, organizations, communities and all levels of government is key to reaching this goal.
